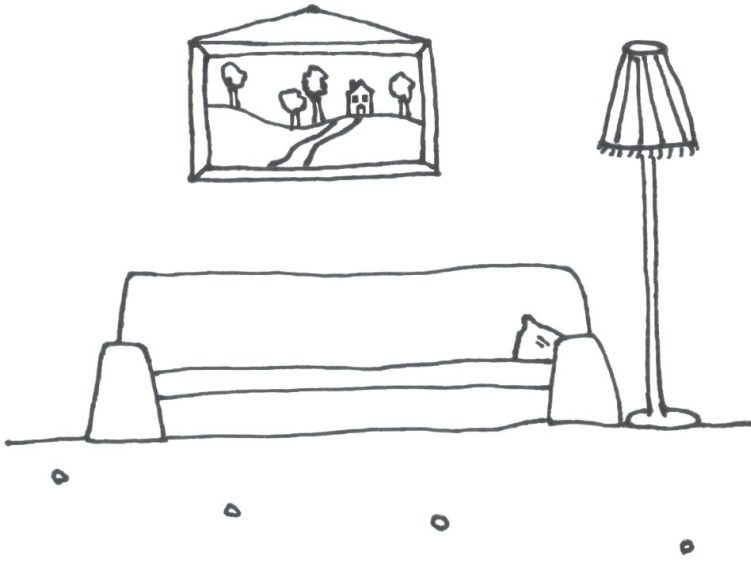

This book is about the household mysteries of the fictional Whitt family. The characters use logic and a little bit of forensic science to solve the mysteries. Who Got Ink on the Rug?

1. Who and What

As Dad scrubs, Dad asks, "Who and what got ink on this rug?"

Mim picks up a pen. Mim runs to Meg with the pen.

Meg checks the pen. The pen

is a mess. The top of the pen is in shreds. Ink is dripping onto Meg's hand. This pen is the "what" that got the ink on the rug.

But who had this pen?

Meg thinks, "If dad can not get rid of the ink spot, then ink is still on who did it." But who did it? Is ink on Liz?

Meg checks. It is not on Liz.

The **Short Vowel Phonics** series was developed and designed based on the experience and training of the author as she tutored struggling readers (including her own child). This series is designed for kindergartners, first grade students, and struggling readers who are ready to read short vowel words. Each story or book slowly builds on the reading skills experienced in the previous story or book.

Short Vowel Phonics 6 is the last book in the series. Readers will experience the words of comprehension: who, what, when, where, why, and how. This book consists of six stories from the fictional Whitt family. The characters use logic and a little bit of forensic science to solve the G-rated household mysteries. The last chapter examines facts on fingerprints. The book uses short vowel words and nine other non-phonetic sight words: a, as, has, his, is, of, the, they, to.

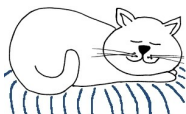
